

# DID YOU KNOW...

## Facts about Marion Technical College

Marion Technical College provides an affordable option to a diverse population of students who otherwise may not, or could not, attend college. MTC is one of 23 state two-year colleges that enroll over 50 percent of Ohio's undergraduate students.

Employment for Ohio associate degree graduates is expected to grow by 19 percent over the next decade, leading all education categories.

### Enrollment

- MTC enrolled 2,791 students Fall Term 2011.
- Enrollment by county:

- The average age of an MTC student is 28.

### Enrollment to-date

- Over 35,000 students have enrolled at MTC for some type of training since 1971.
- Approximately 6,000 associate degree graduates since 1971.

### Transferability of MTC Courses

- Ohio's Transfer Assurance Guide (TAG) program guarantees the transfer of MTC credits to other Ohio public colleges and universities.
- MTC has an agreement with Franklin University that allows associate degree graduates to work toward a bachelor's degree without leaving Marion.
- MTC also has numerous articulation agreements in place with colleges and universities throughout Ohio for MTC graduates to continue their education at the baccalaureate level, including OSUM for nursing.

### Workforce Development

- Each year MTC's Center for Workforce Development (CWD) provides training, testing and related business and industry services to an average of 77 area employers.
- Companies working with the CWD reported a return on investment (ROI) of more than \$10,650,000 during fiscal years 2006 and 2007. On average, Marion area companies invested \$6,400 to save \$710,500 (an ROI of 5,235%)!

### Tuition

- MTC's tuition is \$107 per credit hour or \$1,284 per term for a student taking 12 credits (*Ohio resident*).
- MTC's average annual tuition is **26% less** than the average for Ohio's regional campuses and **57% less** than the average for Ohio public universities' main campus.

### Cost of Education

- The cost of education per full-time equivalent student at MTC is \$6,656. The state share of the cost is approximately 45%.
- Ohio ranks 40<sup>th</sup> in the US in appropriations per student and 17<sup>th</sup> highest in tuition per student.
- Over 85% of MTC's students use financial aid to help pay for their education.

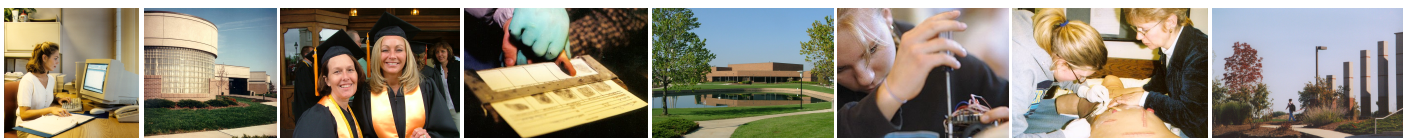

### Licensure Pass Rates

- Graduates of MTC's health programs have historically been very successful in passing their licensure or certification exams.
- For 2010, pass rates thus far (*some graduates have yet to take their exam*):
  - 95% --Physical Therapist Assistant
  - 92% -- Nursing
  - 100% -- Medical Laboratory Technology
  - 100% -- Radiography
- Since 2003, Radiography graduates have a pass rate of 100% on the first attempt at taking the exam!
- Nursing graduates of 2008 ranked in the top 10 for State Board pass rate of all nursing programs in Ohio.

### Graduates and Job Placement (2011)

- 200 graduates; 158 responded to graduate survey (79%).
- Of those seeking employment, 86% reported being employed at the time of the survey.
- 87% considered their job as being "directly" or "somewhat" related to their field of study.
- 84% of the graduates are continuing their education or plan to do so in the future.
- 94% stay in the community and 99% stay in Ohio.
- 92% would recommend MTC to others.
