Iyengar Family Scholarship

Shailesh Iyengar was one of seven children. His parents prioritized education for all of their children. Iyengar earned his bachelor's degree in engineering at the Indian Institutes of Technology (IIT) in Mumbai, India, before coming to the United States to pursue his master's degree. A scholarship helped him earn that degree from Marquette University. He worked at Marion Power Shovel/Dresser Industries as a project manager.

To honor that legacy, in January of 2022 his family started a scholarship fund for engineering technology students at Marion Technical College in Iyengar's memory. Vidya and their adult children, Kavita and Kalpana Iyengar, created this endowed scholarship which will support a student with financial need and strong academic performance.

Vidya Iyengar has used her education to be successful in the local financial services industry for more than three decades. She is the CEO and President of Pillar Credit Union. She believes in Marion.



"This is an investment in Marion's future. I saw how education opened doors for my family. I want to do that for others," Vidya Iyengar said. "Engineering is a great, growing field. I was impressed by the caring, experienced faculty. Shailesh worked at Marion Power Shovel. I can't wait to see what the next generation of engineers creates."

Marion Tech offers a number of engineering technology programs, including electrical, mechanical, robotics, and the new smart manufacturing program. The in-demand fields are in response to the needs of local manufacturers and employers. This new scholarship will help local students enter these competitive fields.

Scholarships Under the Stars

Dr. G. Scott and Pam Drew turned a birthday celebration for Scott into Scholarships Under the Stars to support Marion Technical College students. At the fundraiser at their home on September 28, guests mingled with alumni, students,



faculty and staff from Marion Tech.

Dr. Scott and Pam are both first generation college students. "Someone saved us and said, 'Go to college,'" Dr. Scott said. "It can be really intimidating when you're the first in your family to go to college."

"People walk out of Marion Technical College with jobs in their field," said Pam. "When you go to college, you should have a good life. These programs have a great return on investment."

A personal experience highlighted the importance of Marion Tech for Dr. Scott whose mother was in hospice and two Marion Tech nursing students were assigned to help. They developed a personal bond with the family.

"Mom was their first hospice patient. When she was dying, they came at midnight on a Saturday to be with her, even though it wasn't their shift. They even helped prepare her body to go to the funeral home. They really cared," said Dr. Scott. "They also talked about their experience at Marion Tech. Their passion for Marion Tech's mission really came through."

Dr. Scott has a thriving local dermatology program. Eleven of his 26 employees are Marion Tech graduates.

Marion Co. Commissioner's Grant

This past year the board of Marion County Commissioners authorized the setting aside of \$737,535.87 of miscellaneous general funds to assist various nonprofit programs. The funds are intended to help those that experienced negative economic impacts or disproportionate impacts of the pandemic and meet the definition of "nonprofit."

Marion Technical College was awarded \$100,000 in funding to help create a last-dollar scholarship program for students so they can attend a MTC tuition-free. This funding allowed the college to offer free tuition to 50 new or returning students from Marion County for the 2022-23 academic year.

- The Ernst & Ella Stuckey Scholarship was created to be

given to a second year student from Prospect, Ohio, who has demonstrated financial need and in good academic standing; March.

- Marion Tech awards 432 degrees and certificates to 369 graduates during the **Fiftieth Annual Commencement** drive-through event held on the Marion Campus; May.
- The Mary L. & John I. Brodman Scholarship, was established to help second-year students from Wyandot County in good academic standing

and with financial need; August.

- The **Dr. Bob & Chris Haas** Scholarship was created to assist a former CCP student who is enrolled in Information Technology, Health Information Technology, Radiography or Diagnostic Medical Sonography from Marion, Morrow or Wyandot County; October.
- The annual **Marion Tech Big Tent Event** was held on the Marion Campus; October.
