The College System of Tennessee started piloting co-requisite remediation at 9 of the state's 13 community colleges. "The system saw completion rates for college math jump from 12 percent to 61 percent and from 31 to 64 percent for English" ("Tennessee Board of Regents," 2016). Because of the success of the pilot, co-requisite remediation became implemented throughout the state system. Tennessee's work has been and continues to be inspirational and influential nationally.

Among the model schools in Tennessee for successful implementation of co-requisite remediation is Nashville State Community College. We are thus pleased to have presenters from this school leading the workshop that we are hosting at Marion Technical College. Dr. Sarah Roberts, Dean of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics, and Dr. Patricia Armstrong, Dean of English, Humanities, and Creative Technologies, will be presenting along with an English and a mathematics faculty member.
